Everyone is going outdoors with Michelle, learning the moves in Chess, hoppin' and boppin' with Mary and making the most of all the special opportunities at Spuyten Duyvil!

This past Saturday was our Fall Garden Work Day. Thank you to the families who joined with their delicious foods and generous time- the vines and invasive trees are cut back, a good start was made with the dying plants to be pulled, the wooden edging in the play yard was reinforced and, with special thanks to Sylvie's dad Paul, the 3K Nursery paint easel is now the right height for the kids to work at!

Drop-Off Fridays and Town Meetings:

We have held both but only for 4K so far. This year's 3K group is still a little sensitive to parent separation so we will wait til later in November to bring their parents inside the classroom in such a big way. Town Meetings bring all 3 classes together for shared book, song, face to face group. We rotate which classroom we meet in

Each class will make a collection and then do compare and contrast activities and observational drawings with them. The different pumpkins encourage a fun range of descriptive language too.

One of things you will be hearing from your teachers at the Family Conferences after Thanksgiving is that the kids should be having playdates with their school friends. LENDING LIBRARY –

Another 4K activity starting this week. We hope all our families read to their children regularly. This, along with talking to your children in complex sentences, are the main ways children learn language and, in turn, develop healthy reading and writing readiness skills.

Towards that end, and looking forward to the added responsibility families will have in kindergarten, the children will be choosing books to take home from our school's Lending Library. There will be Reading Tip for parents in their book bag every month to give you specific suggestions. The children will learn to take care of the books and their baggie. Your teacher will tell you which day the books are due back so your child can pick out a few new ones for the next week. If they do not bring back the bag, they cannot take books out for that week. Your child is too young to keep track of which day is which so this becomes another parent task in getting ready for school the night before.

We have a growing collection of books in Spanish and English too. It doesn't matter which language you read in. What matters is that there is language being spoken!!



THIS AND THAT:

- Halloween is coming up next week also. This is a big deal for a lot of families and we certainly support that energy but please remember that we keep school a neutral place. No costumes or candy in school on Oct. 31.
- It is a Dept of Health rule that ALL children under 5 receive this season's **FLU SHOT** by Dec. 31. Unless you have a medical exemption in writing from your child's doctor, there are NO exceptions. Be sure to end me the receipt of the shot when your child gets it. Otherwise we cannot admit your child on Jan. 2!
- Also about annual physical exams- The physicals on file at the school cannot be done more than 12 months ago. When your child goes for their annual check-up be sure to send in the current form, including all immunizations that were due. If the current flu shot is listed there, that is enough proof.

[What Does Too Much Screen Time Do to Children's Brains?](#)

This is an on-going mantra of mine that I will easily share with anyone anytime. When my kids were little it was having them choose which half hour sitcom they would watch



before bed. But I also would give in for a little extra if I wanted an extended shower, or had schoolwork to do and needed some quiet. We all understand that occasional need- but it **MUST** be occasional and it is certainly harder now with smartphones and tablets. And it doesn't help that after preschools warn of this danger, as soon as your child gets to kindergarten, DOE hands them an iPad. I leave it to all of you to fight that. Maybe this article will help you.

But, for now, it is on families to stop the incredibly damaging effect of screens on physical, emotional, social and neurological development. And believe me, we are absolutely seeing the results of young children and electronics more and more every year – less focus, lower levels of self regulation, often limited vocabulary and, even for those who do have fluid use of language, they have more trouble predicting, questioning, imagining, listen to the viewpoints of their peers, investigating, wondering, being physically agile. Mary points this out to us when she works with our classes every Thursday. SO- read more about the science here and limit not only your child's screen time, but your own!
